

## SMOG TEST HELP is here...

If your car **HAS FAILED** or you are concerned that your car **WILL FAIL** the smog emissions test, the Clark County Department of Air Quality and Environmental Management (DAQEM) can assist you, if you qualify.

The DAQEM will provide financial assistance **—up to \$650 per vehicle—** to make necessary engine repairs so that your car will pass the smog test.



This program is designed to assist low-income families. To be qualified for the repairs you must be able to show that you receive Medicaid, TANF, Supplemental Security Income, or Social Security Disability, or have a low income. If your car

has failed the emissions test and you qualify, you can take your car to a designated repair facility. Most repairs can be made for under \$650, and there is a good chance your car will then pass inspection and get the proper certification.

The program benefits you because it makes your car street-legal. It benefits the county because it improves the air we breathe. If you have children, the reduced air pollution will improve their health.

## Vehicle Repair

If your car or truck has failed a smog inspection, you may be eligible to receive up to \$650 in free repairs for your vehicle after a \$35 co-pay. By taking advantage of this offer, you will be helping to clean up our air.

The **Voluntary Vehicle Repair Program (VVRP)** may be able to help pay repair costs for **HIGH-EMITTING** vehicles that have failed a smog check. The program's purpose is to reduce air pollution in Clark County, and it will provide up to \$650 towards the repair of your vehicle. We hope this incentive will encourage you to make repairs that might otherwise be too expensive. In addition to reducing air pollution, these repairs often result in better vehicle performance, extended vehicle life, and improved fuel efficiency.



## Eligibility

1. The vehicle must be a passenger car or light-duty truck that has failed a smog check and has been identified as a **HIGH-EMITTING VEHICLE**.
2. The program is **only for Clark County vehicle registration renewals**; it does not apply to new vehicles. Registrations that have been expired for more than 90 days **will NOT** be accepted in the program.
3. Only the person whose name is on the vehicle registration may receive the repairs.
4. You must provide documentation that you meet the program's eligibility income requirements, such as receiving Medicaid, TANF, Supplemental Security Income, or Social Security Disability, or having a low income.
5. The VVRP will not pay for repairs that exceed the value of the car. Minor repairs may not be covered.
6. The needed repairs cannot be covered under a manufacturer's warranty or recall.
7. The diagnosis and estimate for repairs must come from a Class II Inspection and Repair Station.
8. All repairs must be performed at a participating Class II Inspection and Repair Station.



## Process

1. If a car or truck has been identified as a possible **HIGH-EMITTING VEHICLE**, the DMV Emissions Lab will perform a **FREE** smog inspection to verify emission levels.
2. If you have a **HIGH-EMITTING VEHICLE** and wish to participate in the program, a VVRP Agent will verify your eligibility and provide a list of Class II Inspection and Repair Stations.
3. You must get a diagnosis and estimate from one of the participating repair stations.
4. The VVRP Agent must verify the diagnosis and estimate before authorizing the repairs.
5. After the agent authorizes the repairs, take your car or truck back to the repair shop that did the estimate. They will finish the repairs and do an after-repair smog inspection.
6. After the DMV Emissions Lab on Sahara Ave. confirms the repairs have been completed, VVRP will send a payment of up to \$650 to the repair shop.
7. If the vehicle still does not pass a smog inspection after it has been repaired, the DMV may issue a waiver.
