Students Hone Music Skills at Paradise

Violin, guitar classes offered for ages 6 and older starting Nov. 2

It's never too late or too early to pick up a violin or guitar at Paradise Recreation Center. The center, located at 4775 McLeod Drive, near Tropicana Avenue, offers private lessons on violin and guitar during a six-week session beginning Nov. 2. Students ages 6 and older receive six 30-minute lessons for \$84 per instrument.

Violin students can choose to attend their 30-minute lesson between 5 and 8 p.m. on Wednesdays or 3 and 7 p.m. on Fridays. Guitar students will choose their times between 3 and 7 p.m. on Tuesdays. Instruction times are chosen at the point of registration. Because these are private lessons, classes are geared to work along with each student's progress.

Instructor Desiree Woodruff has been teaching violin for the last five years, while Rick Simon, a University of Nevada, Las Vegas graduate student, instructs the guitar classes.
