Youth Hit the Court in Fall Basketball Leagues Sign-ups Begin Aug. 1 for Sept. 14 Start at Hollywood Center

Hollywood Recreation Center will host its fall youth basketball league beginning Sept. 14 with registration available from Aug. 1 to Sept. 7. Players ages 9 to 11 will participate in one league with ages 12 to 14 in a separate league. All league events take place at the Hollywood Recreation Center, 1650 Hollywood Blvd. near Las Vegas High School. The fee to participate in the youth basketball league is \$55 and includes all referee and coaching fees.

The youth leagues foster teamwork, sportsmanship, safety, fair play and fun in a positive sporting environment. Players are given the opportunity to learn and build upon the basic skills of basketball while having fun in a relaxed but competitive atmosphere. A mandatory parent orientation will take place on Sept. 11 at 6 p.m. for ages 9 to 11 and 7 p.m. for ages 12 to 14. Parents are required to sign a parent code of conduct prior to their child's participation in the league.
