Show Celebrates Freedom Through Song 'Let Freedom Sing' Commemorates Fourth of July Early June 27

The Las Vegas City of Lights Chorus will lead listeners on a musical journey from the Revolutionary War to the present with music performed in the time-honored vocal harmonies of the barbershop style. The 38-member male chorus will perform "Let Freedom Sing" at 2 p.m. June 27 at the Winchester Cultural Center Theater, 3130 S. McLeod Drive. Tickets are \$10.

The performance will highlight songs of Americana including "The Battle Hymn of the Republic," "America, the Beautiful," "Dixie," "God Bless America" and other patriotic favorites from 1776 to the present.

The chorus is part of the Las Vegas Metro Chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society. Three of the society's barbershop quartets - including Good Times, Rumbleseat Daze and Ready or Not - also will perform during the concert along with the Showstoppers Dance Team.
