Clark County Dedicates Red Ridge Park Tanaka Elementary School Participates in Dedication May 27

Clark County Commissioner Susan Brager will dedicate Red Ridge Park at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, May 27. The park is adjacent to Tanaka Elementary School located at 9135 W. Maule Ave. near Durango Drive and the 215 Beltway in southwest Las Vegas.

The 28-acre park includes a water play feature, playground, open soccer field, two Little League baseball fields, picnic area and restrooms.

“This is a wonderful asset for this part of town and one that was really needed,” Brager said. “The Little League fields, the soccer field, the picnic areas and playgrounds are all going to be very popular with residents.”

The dedication will include comments by Commissioner Brager and a performance by Tanaka kindergarteners.
