Seniors Take on Shakespearean Festival Two-Day Trip to Southern Utah Begins Sept. 30

Seniors will watch three different plays at the Utah Shakespearean Festival's Fall Season during an excursion coordinated by the staff at the Winchester Cultural Center, 3130 S. McLeod Drive. The bus will depart the center at 8 a.m. Sept. 30 and return at 8:30 p.m. Oct. 1. Cost is \$195 per person for a double room and \$245 for one person in a single room. Spaces are reserved on a first-come, first-served basis.

Upon arrival in Cedar City, seniors will enjoy lunch on their own at Main Street Grill. After lunch, the festival offers a play orientation, followed by the matinee performance of the hilarious "Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged)." Playgoers will stay at the Abbey Inn, and dining options are located nearby for dinner. After dinner, another play orientation will be followed by the evening performance of "The Women in Black." On the morning of Oct. 1, a continental breakfast will be served at the Abbey Inn before the group attends the matinee performance of "Tuesdays with Morrie," a hilarious farce. On the way home to Las Vegas, the bus will stop in St. George, Utah for dinner.

The package includes transportation, hotel and three shows with seating in the center of the orchestra section.
